
#### **Excellence**







### 22-00001 January 30th 2022

- Fort Thomas Police requested SIRT after a person fired several rounds at Fort Thomas Officers. There were two scenes related to this and a vehicle was searched the following day. SIRT was able to reconstruct the shooting which showed the shooter was resting his hand on the steering wheel as he fired through his windshield towards Fort Thomas Officers.
- Daniel Foster received a 15 year prison sentence

### 22-00002 January 31st 2022

- Southgate Police requested SIRT after a single vehicle fatality accident on 471 South where the passenger was killed but the driver was not seriously injured. SIRT completed a reconstruction and determined black ice caused the vehicle to lose control which then collided with the guardrail then overturned causing the passenger to suffer fatal injuries.
- No criminal charges were filed

### 22-00004 March 16<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Newport Police requested SIRT after locating two homicide victims inside a home. SIRT documented and collected evidence at the scene as well as completed a blood stain reconstruction. Newport Police located a suspect who was charged with Two counts of Murder.
- Eric Lightfoot is currently awaiting trial

### 22-00005 March 27<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Wilder Police requested SIRT after a shooting occurred in the parking lot of Bobby Mackey's. Multiple people had been injured as a result of two people shooting at each other in the parking lot. SIRT collected evidence, documented the scene and completed a shooting reconstruction on two vehicles. It was determined one party was the first shooter and was charged with Assault.
- Barion Graves is currently awaiting trial

### 22-00006 May 28<sup>th</sup> 2022

 Campbell County Police requested SIRT after locating an unresponsive 2year-old child. SIRT collected evidence and documented the scene. After the autopsy it was determined a preexisting medical condition contributed to the child death and no charges were filed against the foster parents.

### 22-0007 May 29th 2022

 Newport Police requested SIRT after a fatal collision occurred on 471. SIRT documented the scene and collected evidence. There were no criminal charges filed.

### 22-00008 June 13<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Fort Thomas Police requested SIRT to assist with a search warrant after a person fired shots at officers. The SWAT team was also on scene and removed the person after a brief standoff. SIRT collected evidence, documented the scene and reconstructed the shooting.
- Andrew Hutchinson is currently awaiting trial.

### 22-00009 July 5<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Newport Police requested SIRT to assist with several search warrants after a
  person was shot inside a vehicle and the shooter fled into a separate location.
   SIRT collected evidence, documented the scene and reconstructed the shooting.
- The suspect was apprehended but the victim in not cooperating so no charges are pending.

### 22-00010 July 11<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Cold Spring Police requested SIRT to assist with a burglary of a car lot where
  multiple vehicles were taken. SIRT processed the scene as well as a stolen vehicle
  that was left at the scene, collected evidence and documented the scene.
- Several suspects were apprehended in Indiana in one of the stolen vehicles.

### 22-00011 July 25<sup>th</sup> 2022

Wilder police requested SIRT assist in documenting a section of Moock Road
where a collision occurred the day prior. The driver of a motorcycle suffered fatal
injuries but did not pass away immediately. SIRT documented the scene. There
were no criminal charges filed.

### 22-00012 August 8<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Fort Thomas Police requested SIRT assist in documenting a scene where a person fired shots at a passing vehicle. SIRT documented the scene.
- Pending criminal charges.

### 22-00013 August 20<sup>th</sup> 2022

### 22-00014 August 20th 2022

- Newport Police requested SIRT for a Fatal hit and run collision where a person on a bicycle
  was struck by an unknown vehicle that fled the scene. SIRT collected evidence and
  documented the scene as well as completed a reconstruction.
- On August 25<sup>th</sup> Newport detectives located the fleeing vehicle in North College Hill. SIRT assisted with seizing the vehicle and returning it to Kentucky. A search warrant was then executed in order to collect evidence from the underside of the vehicle.

### 22-00015 September 16<sup>th</sup> 2022

- Dayton Police requested SIRT for a reported Unlawful Imprisonment and Rape. SIRT assisted executing the search warrant, collected evidence and documented the scene.
- Charges were filed against the reporting party for Filing a False Police Report.

### 22-00016 September 27<sup>th</sup> 2022

• Wilder Police requested SIRT for a fatal collision. SIRT collected evidence and documented the scene. The driver of the vehicle that caused the collision was at fault therefor no charges were filed.

### 22-00017 October 2<sup>nd</sup> 2022

Cold Spring Police requested SIRT for a collision with serious injuries on US 27. SIRT
collected evidence, assisted Cold Spring Police searching a tractor trailer, and documented
the scene. SIRT completed the Collision Reconstruction and determined no charges would
be filed. The driver passed away soon after the collision.

### 22-00018 October 17<sup>th</sup> 2022

 Newport Police requested SIRT for a fatal collision on 471. SIRT collected evidence and documented the scene. SIRT completed the reconstruction and determined no charges would be filed as the driver who caused the collision was the fatality.

#### 22-00019 December 3<sup>rd</sup> 2022

 Newport Police requested SIRT respond to The Brass Bull for a shooting. The victim was removed from the scene but passed away before reaching the hospital. SIRT collected evidence and documented the scene. The suspect was arrested and charged with Murder. SIRT-The Special Investigation Response Team-now has members from 11 of the 12 Police Departments in Campbell County. Many team members completed training related to crime scene or collision investigations. The team hosted specialty training and has arranged to host more training in 2023.
