

# **S.I.R.T. SPECIAL INVESTIGATIONS RESPONSE TEAM**

August 1st SIRT responded to a single vehicle fatal collision at AA and Poplar Ridge. It was determined the driver fell asleep at the wheel and the front seat passenger was killed in the collision. No criminal charges were filed.

SIRT received a Bosch EDR system valued at \$35,000 through a grant from the Ky department of transportation. Campbell county has never had the capability of downloading vehicle collision data and always relied on outside resources.
